PRINCIPAL'S message

"There are no secrets to success. It is the result of preparation, hard work and learning from failure."

Term 3 represents the final teaching and learning term for Year 12 and the last learning term for Year 11 to complete their preliminary HSC studies. The above quote highlights the key ingredient of success namely hard work. I would like to acknowledge the role of parents and caregivers who play a lead role in encouraging our senior and junior students to breakthrough the learning challenges and many distractions that steer them from their goals. Our teachers have been working hard preparing our students for their exams and assessment tasks.

We began the term celebrating education week with the theme 'Proud to belong'. This message is a strong reminder to us all of the importance of public education

where students are accepted at their point of entry into one of the largest education systems in the world. A group of our Pacific Islander students performed the Sasa a Samoan dance at Villawood East Public School's education week celebrations.

Bass High School received a Secretary's Award for an Outstanding School Initiative. The initiative was the Equity Consortium project that involved university partnerships with UTS and UNSW. The university partnership was formed with our English faculty who administered and delivered the co-developed programs. Ms Diasinos from our English faculty achieved a Minister's Award for Teacher Excellence. It is pleasing to see how the efforts of our school and staff are being acknowledged at the state level.

Our Senior Rugby League Teams performed well this term with the Boys reaching the final 6 teams of the School Boys Cup and the Open Girls reaching the semi finals of the NRL Schoolgirl Cup and finishing within the final four teams across Australia. Both teams had players selected in the NSW CHS Teams with Simione Laiafi being selected in the Australian Open Boys Rugby League Team and Trinity Tauanei and Seriah Palepale being selected in the Australian Open Girls Rugby League Team.



I have had meetings with department officers around the new basketball courts with covered roof and the new proposed girls toilet and shower block. Plans are being finalised for these two projects that will lead to them being put out to tender. It is likely that both projects will be finalised and constructed by the end of 2025. Ms Hudson our Girls Adviser has formed a Girls Advisory Group to provide input on the design and plans for the new Girls Toilet Block.

Staffing is looking positive for 2025 with teachers accepting permanent appointments to work at Bass High School in the faculties that include Science, English, HSIE and TAS. We are still looking for staff for the Support Unit, HSIE and Technology. We are looking forward to welcome our new Head Teacher HSIE to Bass High School on the first day of Term 4. Ms Bi has worked at Bass High previously in the Maths Faculty and she was the Year 7 Adviser to the current Year 11 cohort. Ms Bi brings strong leadership and administration skills to Bass High School and will become a valued member of the school's executive team.






























JAPANESE



YEAR 7 CHECK IN ASSESSMENT

Year 7 students participated in the Online Check In assessment during Weeks 2-5. Check In consisted of two assessments in the areas of reading and numeracy.

Year 7 Check In provides schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. It is just one part of a school's assessment and reporting process and does not replace ongoing assessments made by classroom teachers about academic achievement.

YEAR 12 TRIAL HSC EXAMS & PROVISIONS

During Weeks Three and Four of Term Three, the Year 12 cohort sat their Trial HSC Exams in the hall.

Exams can be an exciting and stressful time so the Learning and Support Team have been working with students to alleviate some of the pressure of this time. Many students benefit from special provisions during the exam, and may be eligible for adjustments including small group supervision in the library and/or rest breaks of five minutes per half hour.

Later this term, in Weeks 8 and 9, Year 11 will also sit exams in the hall. Students with additional health, wellbeing, and social needs may be entitled to provisions during these exams.



door is always open.






